Rosa Is No Place For Hate

Rosa International Middle School's commitment to character and creating a school environment in which all students feel safe, valued and accepted has brought the school two amazing honors.

Last month, Rosa was presented with its second National School of Character award. In 2008, Rosa became the first Cherry Hill School to receive that distinction, which brought about a visit from U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan. Rosa received its second award at a ceremony sponsored by the New Jersey and national chapters of

character.org. Stockton Elementary School also received its second award at the ceremony at Rider University, while Bret Harte and the Cherry Hill School District received state awards. A. Russell Knight School was named both a national and state school of character.

On June 6, at a ceremony in Philadelphia at the Walnut Street Theater, the Anti-Defamation League presented Rosa its award as a "No Place For Hate" school. Eleven of Rosa's Peer Leaders along with Library Media Specialist Skye Silverstein and Peer Leadership co-advisor Lillian Halden accepted the

award on behalf of the school. To become a "No Place For Hate" school, there must be evidence that the school has committed to the acceptance and nurturing of all students regardless of race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, religion or socio-economics as well as other factors.

Programming implemented by Peer Leadership and Rosa's Student Council through its character days along with programs put in place by the school administration and individual learning communities demonstrated to the ADL that Rosa truly is no place for hate.
